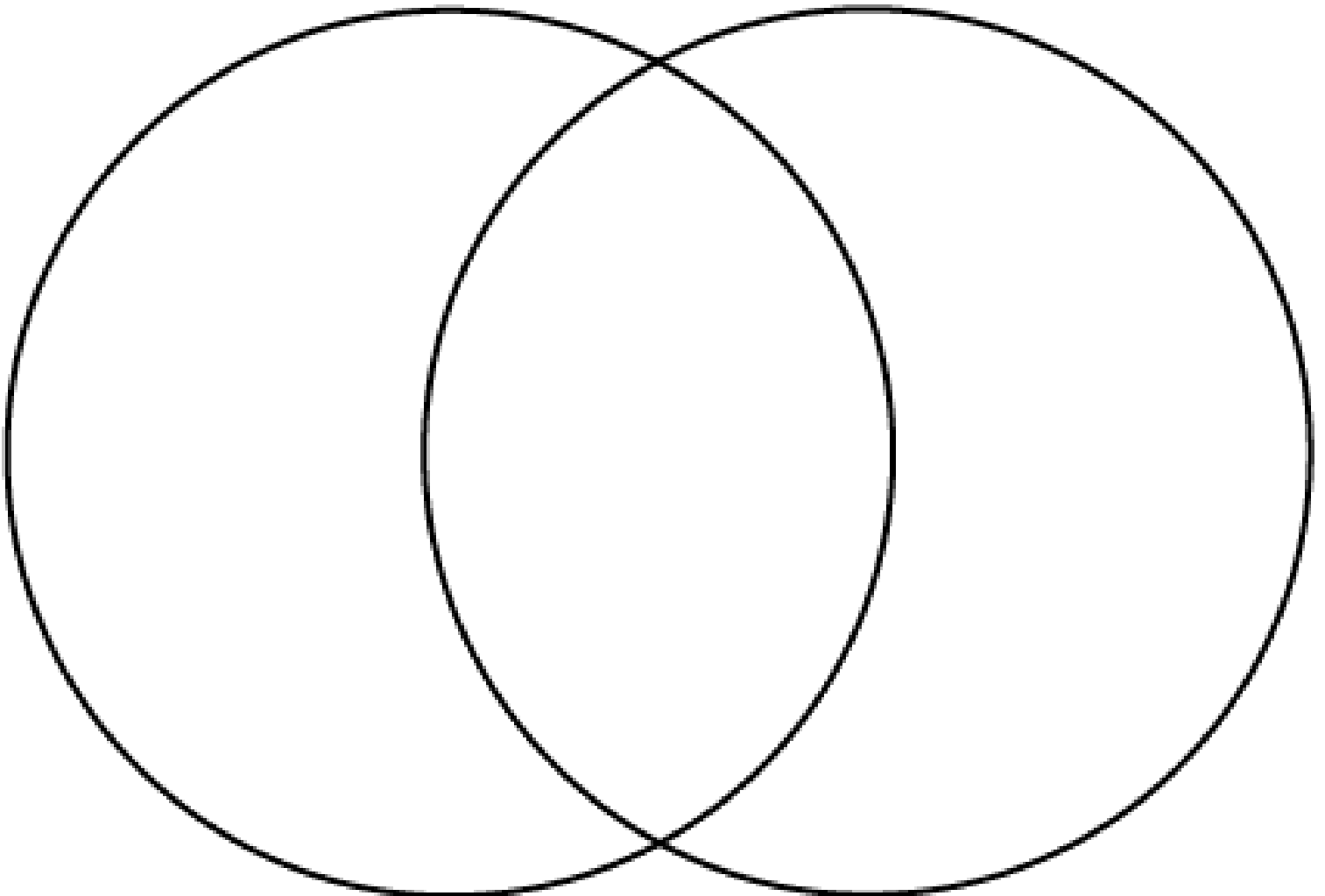
Miracle on 34th Street
